EIOPA launches consultation on Report on Integrated Data Collection

The European Insurance and Occupational Pensions Authority (EIOPA) has published a [discussion paper for its report on integrated data collection for the insurance and pensions sectors](#), launching a consultation to gather stakeholder feedback on potential inefficiencies, overlaps and inconsistencies in regulatory reporting and disclosure requirements, as well as possible improvements.

Latest developments

The discussion paper, published on 13 March, provides an overview of the current reporting landscape for insurers and institutions for occupational retirement provision (IORPs) and explores possible ways to streamline and standardise reporting requirements across the EU.

Stakeholders are invited to respond to the questions set out in the discussion paper and to provide concrete examples of situations where they have faced inconsistencies or duplications when reporting data. Feedback should be submitted via EIOPA's online survey **by 10 June 2026**.

The initiative forms part of a mandate under the revised Solvency II Directive requiring EIOPA to report to the European Commission on potential measures to establish an **integrated data collection system for Europe's insurance and pensions sectors**, with the objective of reducing duplications and inconsistencies, improving data standardisation and data sharing, and lowering compliance costs.

Next steps

The Secretariat will analyse the discussion paper and liaise with Members to gather preliminary input in view of preparing an industry response.
